OBSERVATION AND APPLICATIONS

Read Galatians 5:16-24.

- What does Paul mean by saying we are not under the power of the Law or the flesh in Galatians 5:16-18?
- How does Paul contrast the works of the flesh with the fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 5:19-23?
- What barriers might hinder the growth of the fruit of the Spirit in our lives? How can we overcome them?

Read John 15:1-11.

• How does God's grace and abiding in Him play a role in producing the fruit of the Spirit in our lives?
